


To be permanent infers

Something permanent could never learn, since this would contradict its intrinsic nature, that of being without a need for limits.


There could be no reward or denial for a permanent state, therefore there is no permanent soul that needs to learn anything.






That is to say that if someone

for "self-recognition".











For reincarnation to work
